



St George's Uniform and Appearance Standards

- Students are required to be neat and tidy at all times.
- Students should follow the new uniform item expectations.
- Shirts and blouses are to be fastened to the neck and tucked into the waistband of trousers and skirts.
- Blazers must be worn around school.
- Coats should be normal outdoor coats with no large markings. Coats should be blue or black only. These should not be worn in the school building.
- Shoes must be plain black with no markings or brandings on.
- Students are not allowed to wear rings, necklaces and bracelets.
- Students may wear a pair of small studs (to be worn on the lower lobe only), which must be removed for PE.
- No hats, scarves or gloves are to be worn within the school building or grounds.
- No hoodies should be worn in school, zipped or otherwise.
- Formal black belts to be worn with trousers.
- Shoulder length hair (or longer) must be tied up for health and safety reasons.
- Cosmetics should be kept to a minimum, and be discreet and light (at the discretion of the school staff).
- Fake eyelashes are not permitted.
- Nail colours and/or extensions are not permitted.
- Hair must be worn in a style which, in the judgement of the school, is appropriate for the formal uniform situation and the school workplace. An unnatural, striking appearance (shaved lines or patterns, unnatural colours or haircuts shorter than a number 2) is inappropriate

If in doubt, please speak to your child's Head of Year. Advice should be sought in advance of hair styling or visiting beauticians/nail technicians – we understand that many of these treatments can be expensive, but we will insist that you and your child rectify any breaches to school policy.
